At the appropriate place in the bill, insert the following new section:

4	(a) Plan.—Not later than 180 days after the date
5	of the enactment of this Act, the Director of National In-
6	telligence shall submit to the congressional intelligence

10	cybersecurity and computer literacy among students at-
11	tending high schools or institutions of higher education in
12	the United States. Such plan shall include cost estimates
13	for carrying out the plan and strategies for conducting ex-
14	pedited security clearance investigations and adjudications
15	for purposes of offering such internships.
16	(b) Consideration of Existing Programs.—In
17	developing the plan under subsection (a), the Director
18	shall take into consideration and leverage existing pro-

cation programs of the National Security Agency and the Information Assurance Scholarship Program of the De-3 partment of Defense, as appropriate. 4 (c) Definitions.—In this section: (1) High school.—The term "high school" 5 6 mean a school that awards a secondary school di-7 ploma. 8 (2) Institution of higher education.—The term "institution of higher education" has the 9 10 meaning given the term in section 101(a) of the 11 Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001(a)). SECONDARY SCHOOL.—The term "sec-12 ondary school" has the meaning given the term in 13 14 section 9101 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801). 15
